SEC.529. LANGUAGE TRAINING CENTERS FOR MEMBERS OF THE ARMED FORCES AND CIVILIAN EMPLOYEES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE.

(a) **PROGRAM AUTHORIZED** – The Secretary of Defense may carry out a program to establish language training centers at accredited universities, senior military colleges, or other similar institutions of higher education for purposes of accelerating the development of foundational expertise in critical and strategic languages and regional area studies (as defined by the Secretary of Defense for purposes of this section) for members of the Armed Forces, including members of the reserve components and candidates of the Reserve Officers' Training Corps programs, and civilian employees of the Department of Defense.





- DoD-funded initiative with accredited U.S. colleges and universities established in 2011
- Program goal is to accelerate the development of foundational or higher-level expertise in strategic languages and regional studies for DoD personnel by leveraging U.S. institutions of higher education to meet the existing and demonstrated training needs of DoD units, offices, or agencies






- Held an open competition in Spring 2016; 8 institutions awarded new 3-year grants
- Provided customized, flexible language and cultural training to approximately 1,500 personnel
- Delivered over 340 language and culture courses comprising of over 44,000 contact hours
- Approximately 1,000 DoD personnel completed intensive language training consisting of 120 hours or more of instruction
- > 19 languages offered in response to DoD partner requests
